This is a very accessible book by a guy who is not a biblical scholar but writes in a way that brings the land alive.

Shavit, Ari, **My Promised Land**: The Triumph and Tragedy of Israel. Spiegel and Grau, 2013

This is an excellent book about the foundations of modern day Israel. It takes you through the beginnings of Zionism up to today.

Konner, Melvin **Unsettled: An Anthropology of the Jews**, Penguin Group, 2003

This is a great read about how Judaism has survived from its humble beginnings through today. It's exhaustive but fascinating.

Montefiore, Simon Sebag Jerusalem: **The Biography,** Vintage Books 2011 Another exhaustive book- this one about the history of Jerusalem.
